Chair's report Spring 2011

I have been privileged to be BAPA's chair since the AGM in June 2011, when Adrian Dighe stepped down. Thanks to Adrian's excellent chairmanship I feel that this has been a smooth transition for me.

We are fostering closer links with British Association of Community Child Health (BACCH) by forming a loose affiliation, and as chair I plan to attend the BACCH executive meetings. As part of the affiliation we have been invited to take part in the BACCH Annual Scientific meeting by providing a workshop. The 2011 meeting is scheduled for 11-12th October in Birmingham. BAPA have also been invited to provide the main contribution to BACCH news in the autumn.

As BAPA members reach retirement age our numbers are continuing to fall slightly, and this is likely to continue. There are few paediatricians trained in audiological medicine to take their place, and the medical support for paediatric audiology is at serious risk. Dr Lesley Batchelor has continued in her role as SIG (Specialist Interest Group) convenor for the Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health (RCPCH) and is active on behalf of BAPA. Following talks with Cliona Ni Brolchain who is the chair of the College Speciality Advisory Committee (CSAC) in Community Paediatrics Lesley held

a meeting in Macclesfield. As well as Lesley and Cliona, also present were Dr Katherine Harrop-Griffiths (training adviser from the British Association of Audiovestibular Physicians - BAAP), Dr Ian Doughty (Head of Training for the RCPCH), myself and Lara Smith, also from RCPCH, who advised us on procedure and took notes.

Ian Doughty took the lack of paediatricians training in audiological medicine very seriously. He listened to the concerns and has suggested a way forward. Quite a lot more discussions are required and there are further considerations, but if the suggested plan does come to fruition it could provide a rapid solution for recognised training in our speciality for paediatricians.

As well as her role as SIG convenor, since 2006 Lesley has been the RCPCH representative on the Specialist Advisory Committee Audiological Medicine (SAC Aud Med). Her term of office draws to an end, and in the College Newsletter the RCPCH will be advertising for a replacement.

BAPA had a session on Tuesday afternoon 5th April at the RCPCH Annual conference in Warwick University from 5th - 7th April 2011.

The BAPA Annual Prize Rules

1. The award is named the BAPA Annual Prize
 - 2. Any BAPA member (Full, Associate or Retired) will be eligible for the award apart from members of the Panel (see below)
 - 3. The award will be given for work that promotes the aims of BAPA, which are:
 - (a) The promotion of standards in both training and professional qualifications of paediatricians working in audiovestibular medicine and to contribute to the training of other professionals working in related disciplines.
 - (b) The promotion of multidisciplinary working for the benefit of children and their families.
 - (c) The promotion of multidisciplinary working by maintaining and developing links with other professional bodies.
 - (d) The holding of meetings, lectures and discussions in various regions and the publication at regular intervals of a newsletter for members.
 - 4. This work can be in the form of:
 - (a) a report or publication
 - (b) a presentation to an educational or audit meeting
 - (c) an outstanding contribution to service development and/or multi-disciplinary working.
 - 5. Candidates can themselves apply for the Prize by submitting a report or presentation. Alternatively candidates can be proposed by any full member of BAPA by submission of a citation.
 - 6. The Awards Panel will comprise three assessors, two of whom are BAPA members (one of whom is a committee member) and one non-BAPA member who is actively involved in children's hearing services. The Panel will be nominated annually by the Committee.
 - 7. Submissions should be sent to the Secretariat or Chairman by 30th September each year for consideration by the Panel. If the Panel agrees to make an award this will be presented at the next BAPA Annual General Meeting. If the recipient is unable to attend, the award will be presented in absentia.
 - 8. The award will be in the form of tokens of the recipient's choosing. The value of the award is currently £250.

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
